Research output published: Innovation in Humanities and Social Sciences

Based on the research financed though the Ss. Cyril and Methodius University in Skopje in 2019/20, the research team from the Faculty of Philosophy engaged in the project "Innovation in Humanities and Social Sciences" has published a monograph with the same title. The research and the monograph provide comprehensive outlook on the: (1) conceptual identification of innovation in the humanities and social sciences (related and opposing meanings); (2) discourses and theories; (3) values that affirm or challenge innovation; (4) the context of innovations generated in the humanities and social sciences; (5) the contribution of the humanities and social sciences to innovation, and thus to the development of societies.

The chapter on Sociology and Innovation authored by prof. Antoanela Petkovska provides a conceptual sociological framework for understanding innovation as inevitable cognitive and applicative action that enables the development of the habitus of modern society.

The chapter on Psychology and Innovation authored by prof. Katerina Naumova, presents psychological scientific knowledge on relevant individual, interpersonal, organizational, social and intercultural factors as a catalyst for scientifically based, effective and socially responsible innovations, as well as their application in different life contexts and in different subpopulations.

The chapter on Philosophy and Innovation authored by prof. Marija Todorovska

provides evidence that innovation in all other areas is philosophically motivated, ie based on a philosophical question: "why?" or "why in general (x)?", ie "and what if (x)?". Every innovation is derived from, or encouraged by, philosophy, not only because all science is derived from philosophy, but also because the methods of philosophical wonder are the driving force behind innovation.

The chapter on History and Innovation authored by prof. Vojislav Sarakinski, reflects upon the innovations and technological progress from the point of view of the past, and presents the historical paradigm for the development (positive, but also negative) of society as as a whole, the modality of changes, their source and consequences.

Faculty of Philosophy Centennial Jubilee Monograph

On the occasion of its centennial Jubilee, the Faculty of Philosophy has published a Monograph, that celebrates the Faculty history, its development and the state of teaching and research at the Faculty today. This 400+ pages monograph, published in Macedonian and English language, details the key milestones of the Faculty development. The Faculty of Philosophy was founded in the distant 1920, after WWI, in difficult times and a period of economic crisis brought about by war and pandemic. Classes in the 1920 commenced with only 35 students in History, Philosophy, Pedagogy, Linguistics and Literature, with a teaching staff made up of the then academic and cultural elite. According to the Faculty of Philosophy, from 1946 to 1974 that number was 4,000. From 1974 to 1991, the Faculty of Philosophy had seen 14,523 students, and from 1991 to 2020 – 21,209 students.

Today, the Faculty of Philosophy is a modern, interdisciplinary faculty consisting of 12 institutes of humanities and social sciences, with 105 teachers and about 3,000 students enrolled on undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate - PhD studies. As of the academic year 2019/20, there are of 19 accredited study programs of first cycle studies with 240 ECTS credits, 34 accredited study programs of second cycle studies with 60 or 120 ECTS credits and 6 accredited study programs of third cycle studies with 180 ECTS credits. These study programes offer BA, MA and PhD degrees in the following disciplines: philosophy, history, pedagogy, sociology, classical studies, history of art and archeology, psychology, social work and social policy, special education and rehabilitation, security defense and peace, gender studies, and family studies.

In addition to teaching, the Faculty of Philosophy has a developed scientific research and international activity. There are 12 research centers within the Faculty. Also, the Faculty publishes 12 international scientific journals. The Faculty of Philosophy has 101 active Erasmus agreements with European universities, participates in 6 CEEPUS university mobility networks and has numerous bilateral agreements with universities around the world. International Week "Exploring Pandemics from Humanities and Social Sciences"

From 15 to 19 February 2021 the Faculty of Philosophy held the third International Week. This year the event was held online, and the theme was "Research on pandemics through the humanities and social sciences." Ten professors from universities in Canada, Israel, the United Kingdom, France, Italy, the Netherlands, Poland and Slovakia gave lectures at the event. The topics of the lectures were related to the pandemics, but their focus was on rarely commented aspects or perspectives in the public discourse. Some of the titles of the lectures included: "Social life and pandemics: notes on the bio-sociability of the infection"; "The Classical Myth and Its Acceptance in Response to a Crisis", "Character Education in a Pandemic", "The Psychological Context of Accepting Conspiracy Beliefs During a Pandemic", "The Covid-19 Social Policy Response" and others. This year the lecturers are from the disciplines: philosophy, classical studies, art history and archeology, sociology, pedagogy, psychology and social policy. The event was also used to promote the Erasmus project "Development of new software for psychomotor re-education of children with autism" by the coordinator of Canakkale University in Turkey, a project in which the Faculty of Philosophy also participates as a partner.
