

Alejandro Bendaña, served as Ambassador of Nicaragua to the United Nations and Secretary General of the Nicaraguan Foreign Ministry between 1980 and 1990. He holds a PhD in History from Harvard University. In 1991 he founded the Centro de Estudios Internacionales in Managua. In 1992-93, Dr. Bendaña was Tinker Professor of Latin America History at the University of Chicago. From 2002 to 2016 he worked in various international organizations in peace-building programs in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. Between 2014 and 2015 he served as Senior Mediation Advisor in the UN Department of Political Affairs. Among his publications are *Power Lines: US Hegemony in the New Global Order* (Interlink, New York, 1996), and a biography of the Nicaraguan nationalist Sandino, *Patria y Libertad* (Anama, Managua, 2016), considered by the American Historical Review to be the “definitive biography of Sandino.” His most recent book is *Buenas al pleito, mujeres en la rebelión de Sandino* (Anama, Managua, 2019).
