Vassilis K. Fouskas is Professor of international politics and economics at the Royal Docks School of Business and Law, University of East London (UK), where he co-directs the Centre for the study of States, Markets and People (STAMP). He has published extensively in the fields of history, political economy and international relations. With Bulent Gokay, he has completed a trilogy on the decline of the USA and the power-shift to Asia and China, translated into many languages. Vassilis held many academic posts and fellowships, including a Visiting Fellowship at Princeton University and a Leverhulme Trust Fellowship. He has worked, among others, as Reader and Senior Lecturer in international relations at the Universities of Stirling (Scotland) and Kingston (UK). In 1998 he founded and has since been editing the academic periodical *Journal of Balkan and Near Eastern Studies* published eight times a year by Routledge-Taylor & Francis. He is the chief adviser to the professional network, REDETE (Researching Entrepreneurship and Development in Transition Economies), based in the Faculty of Economics, University of Banja Luka, BiH, and is a Visiting Professorial Fellow in the same University. He is currently co-authoring a monograph on Turkey and the political economy of sub-imperialism, forthcoming by Palgrave-Macmillan in 2024.
